Concentration in International Educational Development: This concentration is available for any Ph.D. or Ed.D. program at the Graduate School of Education, and reflects a cross-school, thematic cluster of courses focusing on issues of international educational development. Students who are accepted into the concentration, and complete the requirements listed below, will be able to request a formal notation to appear on their transcript at the completion of their doctoral studies, which will read "Concentration in international educational development."

Requirements for the Concentration in International Educational Development: Five (5) Course Units (minimum) are required for the Concentration. Each course equals one course unit. Both the "Home" Program advisor and an IEDD Advisor will assist students in determining the best program of study. Courses selected will thus need to fit in with the "Home" program of study.

**Application Process:** After discussion with IEDD faculty and "Home" faculty advisor, please complete this form and submit all required documents to the IEDP Program Manager for review. This process should generally be completed within the first two years of study, although exceptions can be made.
