

Financial aid process for First Year Professional School Counseling Program Students:

The Vice Provost's Office of the University of Pennsylvania has approved the following Tuition and fees schedule for the Professional School Counseling Program for Summer 2008 through Spring 2009:

Tuition and Fees total for one calendar year: \$38,660. Billing according to course units (CU's) per semester:

- 3 CU's Summer II
- 3 CU's Fall
- 4 CU's Spring

Tuition and Fees total include the following:

- -All text books will be provided, and all related printed materials will be available on Blackboard for your review and printing needs
- -Course Instruction via classroom, Blackboard and internet
- -Routine faculty advising including all aspects of academic, field placement, and career goal guidance
- -Automatic course registration by Applied Psychology-Human Development administrative office
- -Student services provided by Applied Psychology-Human Development and Graduate School of Education administrative offices
- -Financial Aid advising and services from Graduate School of Education and University of Pennsylvania Student Financial Services Offices
- -All meals for 7/27-8/3 summer II semester
- -All meals for weekend sessions fall and spring semesters
